INDIANAPOLIS.....Records are expected to fall in the "500" Classic at the Indianapolis Speedway Monday. The 33 car starting field has qualified at the fastest average speed in history, 156.058 miles per hour. Pole sitter, A.J. Foyt, a two time winner, set a four lap record of 161.233 miles an hour as well as a one lap mark of 161.958. Twenty eight of the drivers took advantage of the three hour chance for practice runs Saturday, although the yellow caution light flashed five times. The weatherman predicted sunny skies and temperatures in the 70's for the 49th running of the big race.

BY BPI.....Britains Graham Hill, driving a BRM has won the Monaco Grand Prix Auto Race for the third straight year. Hill with a record average speed of 74.18 MPH finished ahead of Italian Lorenzo Bandini and Scotland's Jackie Stewart. England's John Surtees ran out of gas on the last lap and was officially placed fourth. Australian Paul Hawkins had a miraculous escape when his Lotus crashed through the banking coming out of a turn on the 85th lap and his car landed in the sea. Hawkins was thrown out and managed to swim onto a rescue boat, apparently unharmed.

CHICAGO.....Chicago Bear pass catching star Johnny Morris has signed his contract for next season. Morris set a National Football League record of 93 interceptions before he broke his collarbone in the final game.
