WASHINGTON.....President Johnson announced that the unemployment rate in May fell sharply to 4.6%..the lowest figure in more than 7 years.

DENVER...William Louis Parent, a photographer, explained in court why he wanted a divorce from his wife of 22 years. He said when he appeared in a Justice of the Peace Court on a traffic charge, she called from the spectators area, "Give him the maximum." Parent's divorce request was denied.

CAPE KENNEDY.....U.S. Astronauts James A McDivitt and Edward White will earn \$2.25 per-hour...or \$3.38 per orbit, on their Gemini 4 flight. If they return home after four days as originally planned, the U.S. Government will write them a check for \$220 each, their flight pay for one month. To collect flight money, each must fly at least four hours a month and ten hours per year.

VANDENBERG AIR FORCE BASE, CALIFORNIA...The Air Force launched an Atlas D Intercontinental Ballistic Missile yesterday down the Pacific Missile Test Range. In an announcement, the Air Force said the launching "was made in support of the U.S. Army's Nike Zeus Anti-Missile-Missile Program."

WASHINGTON.....The House Government Operations Committee called yesterday for immediate Military Development of manned space stations, possibly costing 5 to 12 billion dollars each. It said Defense aspects of space were being neglected.

FUKUOKA, JAPAN...The official death toll in the Yamano Mine gas explosion rose to 237 with the death of another miner. Thirty-seven workers were injured in the blast Tuesday, the biggest mine disaster in Japanese history.

TALLAHASSEE, FLORIDA.....The Florida Legislature passed a law restricting driving privileges to people only. The Bill was introduced after Tampa Police stopped a car with a chimpanzee at the wheel, but later discovered they could not prosecute the animal or its owner.

LAFAYETTE, INDIANA.....Purdue University announced that beginning July 1st, it will list rooms for rent to students only where landlords agree to comply with its policy against Racial Discrimination.

BRIGHTON, ENGLAND.....Harold Joseph Case, charged with parking his car in a taxi stand, told the Court he measured the stand and found it longer than permitted by Local Laws. The Court agreed Case had therefore parked at least part of his car on a Public part of the road...and dismissed the charge.
