



NASSAU BAHAMAS.....June Douglas, a Palm Beach Florida Stock Broker, pushed her Cherokee 180 Airplane to a comfortable victory in the 1,468 mile air race which started in New Jersey and ended here.

HOLLYWOOD.....Satirist Mort Saul will have no impediment of his normal speech as a result of throat surgery. Saul, 38, underwent successful surgery Friday to remove tissue from his larynx.

INDIANAPOLIS.....There were no accidents to mar Saturday's three hour final practice session for drivers in the 500 at Indianapolis, although the yellow caution light flashed five (5) times. Twenty-eight (28) of the thirty-three (33) starting drivers for Monday's race made it onto the two and one half mile oval with the cars averaging up to more than 150 miles per hour. Rookie Mickey Rupp blew his engine, Scotsman Jimmy Clark ran out of line, 1963 winner Pernelli Jones had handling problems and Bobby Unser and Johnny Boyd stalled on the track. In each case, the caution light flashed. Rupp's car will have a new engine and is expected to be ready to go in the flying start on Monday. After the machines were put through their paces, the pit crews got their chance. Another three hour period saw mechanics and other pit men going through careful test steps to see how rapidly they can change tires, refuel and perform other services.

LOS ANGELES.....The Los Angeles Dodgers are leading the National League but they figured that they needed a little more help. The Dodgers moved to bolster hitting and defense by restoring coach Jim Gilliam to the active list. Gilliam is capable of playing second, third and the outfield and will be used as a utility man and pinch hitter. To make room for Gilliam, the Dodgers are selling Griffith Derrel to Spokane.
