

TOKYO.....Red China Saturday flatly rejected Soviet calls for International Communist Unity to win the war in Viet Nam.

BY UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL.....Part of an estimated 87 million cars entered the Nations highways Saturday for the long weekend. The National Safety Council estimated that 430 to 510 persons would be killed in automobile accidents over the long weekend.

AMMAN JORDAN.....Jordan charged Saturday that another Israeli Patrol entered this area Friday night and exchanged fire with Jordanian Troops. There were no indications of casualties in the clash.

NEW YORK.....Democratic Mayor, Robert Wagner may not run for re-election, a spokesman for the Mayor said Friday night. The spokesman said the Mayor is not sure of his future political plans and probably would not give a decision immediately.

WASHINGTON.....United States Officials said Saturday that creation of the Inter-American Peace Keeping Machinery proposed by President Johnson in the wake of the Dominican Republic Crisis is likely to take a long time.

JOHNSON CITY, TEXAS.....President Johnson paid a birthday tribute Saturday to his slain predecessor, John F Kennedy, and to Kennedy's dedication to the "Worthy Cause" of fighting mental retardation.

WASHINGTON.....The House Education and Labor Committee added 395 million dollars to Johnsons request for 1.5 billion dollars for an Anti-Poverty Program.

LEOPOLDVILLE.....Congolese Government Troops spearheaded by white mercenaries Saturday closed in on the last two Rebel Strongholds in the Northern Congo in an effort to rescue about 100 whites held hostage by the Insurgents.

BRANDON, MISSISSIPPI.....More than 250 singing, chanting Civil Rights Demonstrators marched into this rural county seat Saturday ending a two day 14 mile march dramatizing Negro voting grievances in Mississippi.

HAMBURG, GERMANY.....Two West German Destroyers escorted the British Royal Yacht Britannia down the Elbe River to the sea Saturday, as Queen Elizabeth returns to her homeland.

CRAWFORDVILLE, GEORGIA.....About 100 Negroes, most of them children, were permitted for the first time in history Saturday to use the recreational facilities of the Alexander Stephens Memorial State Park.

SANTO DOMINGO.....Brazilian General Hugo Panasco Alvin arrived Saturday to take formal command of the Peace Force which is trying to keep order in this divided city.

HAVANA.....The Cuban Revolutionary Tribunal has sentenced two American Baptist Ministers to jail terms on a number of charges, including espionage, it was announced.

WASHINGTON.....Members of the Kennedy Family and a Representative of President Johnson made memorial visits to the Arlington Cemetary grave of former President John Kennedy, who would have been 48 years old Saturday.

SANTO MONICA, CALIFORNIA.....Actress Linda Darnell left her estate, valued at less than \$10,000 to her 17 year old daughter, Charlotte Mildred Marley, it was revealed Friday.
